**Under this agreement for 2019
Bullyard State School will receive**

\$24,015*

This funding will be used to

- Ensure that students in Years 3 and 5 will attain or exceed the National Minimum Standard in Reading and Writing or have an appropriate individual curriculum plans.
- Increase the percentage of students in the Upper 2 Bands across all areas.
- Implement Early Start Assessment to identify students requiring targeted support in P-3
- Supplement Full Time Equivalent teacher allocation to provide an additional teacher to run a P-2, 3-4, 5-6 class structure in the areas of Humanities and Social Sciences (HASS) and Science to allow for deeper age appropriate learning in these subject specific areas.
- Provide teacher-aide time to run speech language therapy programs for identified students 3 days per week.

Our initiatives include

- Employment of a support teacher / learning support to provide necessary intervention of students at risk of not achieving the National Minimum Standard in Reading and Writing.
- Employment of an enrichment teacher to provide extension activities to students at or close to the upper two bands.
- Employment of a class teacher for one day a week to maintain the year 3/4 cohort. Students across the school will focus on Science and HASS on this day.
- Provide Teachers and Teacher Aides with professional development, coaching and feedback through a coaching model.

Our school will improve student outcomes by

• Employing a Teacher for Learning Support and Enrichment.	\$5,000
• Employing a Teacher for data collection and analysis.	\$5,000
• Employing a Teacher for the Year 3/4 HASS/Science Class.	\$8,000
• Providing staff with coaching / feedback / observation time.	\$6,015
